Family Justice Center which includes YWCA legal advocates, and City and County law enforcement and prosecutors. These programs benefit more than 16,000 women and children annually.

The YWCA of Spokane is the go-to place in the region for services that empower women and children, support for victims of domestic violence, work readiness resources, and early childhood education. The organization is also a key partner in coalitions in the community working on issues of racial and social justice.
