The YWCA of Spokane is a multi-service non-profit organization whose mission is eliminating racism, empowering women and promoting peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all. For over 113 years the YWCA has been committed to empowering women in the Spokane community.

The YWCA's three umbrella programs include the Alternatives to Domestic Violence Program, Spokane County's only state-recognized program for domestic violence; the Women's Opportunity Center, an established Workforce Connection Site; and Child Services which includes four sites implementing the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program.
