Stay Put. Don't Panic.

Getting an eviction notice can be scary. Stay in your rental and use free resources when facing eviction. Washington State has protections in place to help tenants.

NEXT

Respond to Eviction Notices

Contact the Dispute Resolution Centers (DRC) to initiate or respond to mediation requests within 14 days.

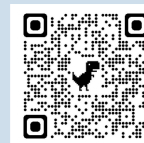

Go to All Appointments & Keep In Touch

Contact the DRC for your last name within 14 days of receiving an eviction notice, **AND** keep in contact with them. Avoiding meetings, calls, texts, and emails **WILL RESULT** in a certificate being issued and the eviction process proceeding.
